A TASTE OF FORMULA 1



For two weekends, International Formula Master showed clearer than ever before where it belonged on the echelons of motorsport, fitting easily alongside Formula 1, the GP2 Series and Formula BMW. THE SERIES

International Formula Master combines live TV coverage, world-class venues, thrilling racing and cost-efficiency.

Running as part of the FIA Formula 1 World Championship and the FIA World Touring Car Championship race weekends this season, IFM has a ready-made profile instantly establishing it as one of the more prominent pathways to the highest echelons of motorsport. Add to that Eurosport's commitment to the Series as host broadcaster until 2012, which includes live TV coverage throughout the season such as Sunday races LIVE on Eurosport International, and IFM drivers can benefit from unparalleled global attention for this level of motorsport.

To capitalise on this platform, the Series features an exceptional car, designed to be a crowd-pleaser with its lightweight body and powerful engine. It's a format that definitely establishes International Formula Master as the formula to success.

POWERING UP

International Formula Master champion Fabio Leimer claimed his winner's prize on 11 November 2009, a day testing with GP2 Series team DAMS at the Paul Ricard circuit in France.

The young Swiss driver was rewarded with the test for his dominant championship campaign which saw him win seven races and secure six pole positions throughout the 2009 Formula Master season.

Dams Managing Director Eric Boullier, who has worked with the 2007 IFM champion Jérôme D'Ambrosio throughout 2008 and 2009, was present and said: "Today's results didn't show Fabio's real talent. We had a technical problem on the car, which didn't help him get to the top of the timesheet. The whole team really appreciated working with Fabio though and the results he has produced in Jerez and the GP2 Asia Series show how competitive Formula Master drivers are and ready they are to fight at the top of the GP2 category."

Jenzer Motorsport graduate Leimer added: "Working with the team



today was very good; we had some issues with finding the right set-up, which unfortunately showed in the lap times but they never gave up. We kept trying all day and, from an engineering point of view, it was absolutely great to work with them."

ARABADZHIEV GETS FIRST WTCC TASTE THANKS TO CHEVROLET

JD Motorsport's Vladimir Arabadzhiev enjoyed his first taste of the FIA World Touring Car Championship (WTCC) on 15 October 2009 in Pembrey, United Kingdom, thanks to the Chevrolet WTCC team.

The Bulgarian was chosen by the team to test their WTCC race car, the Cruze, alongside official driver Rob Huff, as a reward for a top season within International Formula Master this year.

As part of the test, Arabadzhiev was given the

chance to complete both a qualifying run and a race outing of ten laps, and said: "To spend a day working with a WTCC's works team has been a great opportunity for me. It doesn't happen often that young formulae drivers are given a chance to explore other motorsports top disciplines, like touring cars, in such a professional environment. It was a very interesting experience, as it was quite unusual to drive a front wheel drive race car for the first time. The team was very helpful to get me comfortable in the car and build my confidence before giving me a new set of tyres to do a qualifying run before a ten-lap race run. Rob Huff was available to give me some



tips regarding his car and this proved useful to improve my lap times. I wish to thank Chevrolet and IFM for giving me this opportunity."

Although no official times were recorded,
Arabadzhiev is said to have set qualifying
times within seven tenths of experienced
WTCC driver Huff, whilst the Bulgarian's race
run saw him set a best lap just three tenths
hehind Huff.

Eric Nève, Chevrolet Europe Motorsport Manager, added: "One of the good things about the WTCC sharing racing weekends with the International Formula Master Series is the possibility to cooperate and to organise test sessions with their drivers, which allow us to look at young talents coming from single-seaters and allow a new generation of drivers to look for opportunities in the touring car scene. We are delighted to have Vladimir Arabadzhiev, a promising driver from one of the emerging European countries in motorsports, as the first IFM driver testing a Chevrolet and we are very satisfied with the extremely professional job he did during the test day."



NOT)QUITE BACK TO AMERICA

Top 2009 Rookie Alexander Rossi secured the IndyLights prize test after a stunning debut season, which saw him claim three wins and finish fourth in the overall driver standings.

The young American, just 17 when the season ended, was due to test with illustrious IndyLights team Sam Schmidt Motorsport, which holds the Indy Lights race-win record with 30 victories and three series championships to date. Set for the 19-20 October 2009 at Putnam Park in Indiana, the prize was rescheduled for January 2010 however, when Rossi secured an Abu Dhabi-drive in the GP2 Asia Series with Ocean Racing Technology.

ROOKIES AT THE READY

International Formula Master's two-day rookie test at the Hungaroring in Hungary was topped by 17-year-old Swiss Nico Muller on day one, as he posted a quickest time of 1:37.713.

The rookie completed 53 laps throughout the day, driving for Jenzer Motorsport, and shared the top of the timesheets with Brazilian Cesar Ramos in the rival

Gary Thompson. The Irish 17-year-old, currently ranked second in Formula BMW Pacific, completed his best lap in 1:47.500. Cesar Ramos claimed the morning's fastest time in 2:05.799, whilst his best time overall of 1:48.100 ranked him fourth.

Motorsport car. Fastest that morning, Formula 3 Euroseries graduate Ramos produced an overall best lap of 1:37.860, placing him second, whilst completing 78 laps.

Following in 2009 IFM rookie Alexander Rossi's footsteps, American Conor Daly tested for AR Motorsport, after finishing third in the Star Mazda series this season. The 17-year-old son of former Formula 1 driver Derek Daly was third overall with a fastest time of 1:38.092, ahead of Denmark's Mikkel Mac who drove his Iris Project single-seater around the Hungarian track in 1:38.446. Formula Palmer Audi graduate and fellow Iris Project driver Phillippe Frommenwiler followed with a quickest lap of 1:38.600. Other rookies featuring in the IFM evaluation included the 2009 Formula BMW Pacific runner-up Gary Thompson, testing for Jenzer **Motorsport and top Formula Renault 2.0 Sweden and NEZ finisher Philip Forsman** who drove for AR Motorsport.

Day two saw Forsman set the fastest time in 1:45.900 on a drying track, following overnight downpours.

Nico Muller was second fastest, posting a quickest lap of 1:47.100, ahead of team-mate

of 1:48.900 and 1:49.200.

JD Motorsport tester Riccardo Galli, from Switzerland, was seventh, with a best time of 1:49.900, with Italy's Andrea Roda eighth fastest for Cram Competition with a 1:50.400 lap.

"The car felt great considering it's the first time I've driven it and the team was extremely helpful. I set my best time on a long run and felt confident all day. I'm hoping to race in the Series next year so this was a great first day."

"IFM is a really good category with the level of technology in the car and a budget that fits in with my plans. The prizes have also been great over the years and it's proven that the car prepares you really well for the next level of racing.

"Considering how big the car is, compared to what I'm use to, it was easier to drive than other single-seaters I've tested and the paddle-gear shift is very interesting."

Conor Daly, AR Motorport

"I've been testing several categories in Europe recently as the goal is to compete over here next season. I drove a Formula Renault as well as a Formula 3 and now Formula Master. I have to say the IFM is the best car I've ever driven! It's really well made and looks like a Formula 1 car; it's very professional."

Philip Forsman, AR Motorsport

"The car felt so much more like a racing car than what I've driven before, I only tested in the morning session on day one and was third fastest. We worked on a drying track on day two but I managed to be fastest which is great.

"The grip is great with this car but I had to be very smooth to avoid any wheel spin. I raced with AR Motorsport this season just gone and I hope to be back next year with them in IFM."

"IFM is a good option and a brilliant car, which is why I wanted to test it. The test was ok, the car has a lot more downforce than I'm used to but we still got to set some decent times today despite the drying conditions."





Round 01

International Formula Master's inaugural round of the season saw Jenzer Motorsport's Fabio Leimer clinch a commending victory in Pau, France, after leading from start to finish. The young Swiss secured pole position during qualifying, which he kept despite a difficult start, thanks to fellow front-runner JD Motorsport's Josef Kral hitting the barriers on lap one.

This promoted Vladimir Arabadzhiev to second, also driving for JD Motorsport, which he kept for the remainder of the race. Despite closing the gap towards the later stage of the race, third-place finisher Pål Varhaug was unable to catch Arabadzhiev and took the final step on the podium for Jenzer Motorsport.

"I didn't have the best start," said Leimer. "Josef [Kral] got alongside me and could have passed me if he hadn't gone off. I had to be careful in the middle part of the race as I had some tyre wear but otherwise it was a straight-forward win and I'm really pleased for myself and the team; things couldn't have gone better."

Round 02

Cram Competition's Alessandro Kouzkin scored his first IFM victory in the Series' second round. Starting fifth, the 16-year-old rookie climbed through the field before overtaking AR Motorsport's Dennis Retera for the lead in a daring late-braking move on lap nine.

Starting from the front row, Retera had to fend off Trident Racing's Frankie Provenzano and Cram Competition's Harald Schlegelmilch before losing his place to Kouzkin. Both Provenzano and Schlegelmilch failed to complete the race, whilst Retera claimed second place.

Varhaug scored his second podium-finish of the weekend with a third place thanks to a clean race, as well as Provenzano and Schlegelmilch's retirements. "I had a good start and then I passed Dennis; that was important," said Kouzkin. "It was a difficult race but a special race for me because it's my first win and I'm very happy about this! I hope to do a fantastic race again in Valencia."

Round 03

Fabio Leimer led round three from start to finish, after qualifying on pole position. The young Swiss enjoyed a strong start, maintaining his lead despite Josef Kral following him closely into the first corner. An incident involving ADM Motorsport's Earl Bamber and Iris Project's Simon Trummer brought out the safety car soon after, giving Kral a chance to fight for the lead once again. Unfortunately the Czech wasn't able to convert his restart pace into a pass and eventually finished in second place.

Fellow JD Motorsport driver Vladimir Arabadzhiev claimed third place despite starting fifth on the grid. The Bulgarian overtook Hitech Racing's Kasper Andersen in the earlier stages of the race, before benefiting from team-mate Sergey Afanasiev's retirement on lap seven.

"I had a good start but Josef was alongside me and he was really close, I thought he could pass me," said Leimer. "After I got settled in the race and it was ok."

Round 04

Andersen claimed the first win for his team in round four. After passing Jenzer Motorsport's Nicolas Maulini and fellow Hitech Junior driver Alexander Rossi at the start, Andersen led the race to the chequered flag to claim his first IFM win since Anderstorp in 2007.

Starting fifth, Pål Varhaug fought hard with Rossi on the first lap before catching Maulini and passing him on lap five. The young Norwegian then had to defend his position against JD Motorsport pair Kral and Afanasiev, before claiming second place, his highest IFM finish of the season to date. Afanasiev claimed the final podium finish in third place, having started the race in P11. The Russian driver enjoyed a strong start and climbed to sixth place on the first lap before working his way through the field to finish third.

"It's great for the team and me," said Andersen. "I've always done well here in Valencia and leading the race like this really gave me flashbacks from 2007!"

Round 05

Jenzer Motorsport claimed this season's first one-two finish with drivers Fabio Leimer and Pål Varhaug in round five at the Automotodrom Brno in the Czech Republic. Leimer took his third victory of the season despite qualifying in P3. A strong start saw the young Swiss pass Josef Kral, before overtaking team-mate Varhaug on lap four. ISR's Alexander Rossi claimed an historic first win in round six. Taking the lead on lap one from Nicolas Maulini, Rossi raced to the chequered flag unchallenged to secure the first ever American win in International Formula Master, as well as the first ever ISR victory in the Series.

Running second for the majority of the race, Kral received a black flag for failing to pit with a broken front wing, promoting team-mates Vladimir Arabadzhiev and Sergey Afanasiev to second and third place respectively. "I had a good start, my best of the season so far, and the opening laps were pretty close but after that nothing happened. Round 07

Fabio Leimer claimed his fourth win of the season in round seven at the Brands Hatch circuit in England. Starting from pole position, the young Swiss lead the field from start to finish, despite pressure from Josef Kral in the closing stages of the race.

Having qualified fourth yesterday, Kral produced a strong start to overtake team-mate Sergey Afanasiev and ISR's Erik Janis. Kral pushed hard to keep Leimer within his grasp, attempting to overtake him on lap 26 of the 28-lap round to no avail. Kral eventually finished second, ahead of team-mate Afanasiev who raced to the finish unchallenged in third.

"I saved my tyres as much as possible during the middle stint of the race and managed to keep him behind me in the last laps, which allowed me to take the win."

Round 08

Alessandro Kouzkin scored his second win in IFM's round eight on Sunday. Leading the Series' 40th race from start to finish, Kouzkin kept first place, withstanding pressure from Alexander Rossi in the later stages of the race.

"It was a good race, especially in the beginning," said Kouzkin.
"After that I had a few problems with oversteer in the middle of corners but it was ok in the end. I won, and it was a special day today, because it was my second win of the season after Pau."

Round 09

Round 11

Having qualified on pole position, the Swiss lost the lead briefly to Alexander Sims after a poor start. Leimer was back in front before the race's first lap was completed however, and raced to the finish line unchallenged.

Round 12

Alexander Rossi stormed to his second win of the season in round 12. Starting fourth, the young American was up to second as the field charged through the first corner, before the safety car was deployed following an incident on the grid.

Sims had been left stranded on his P3 slot as the lights went out, with AR Motorsport's Kelvin Snoeks unable to avoid him, resulting in three laps of safety car period.

Rossi took the lead of the race a lap after the restart, racing to the chequered flag unchallenged, despite a strong drive from Leimer who finished the 12-lap race less than a second behind. Erik Janis claimed his share of overtaking in the unrelenting round, climbing from fifth to the last podium-finish position in third, ahead Afanasiev.

"I had a good start with Sims dropping out," said Rossi. "Then the safety car was out for three laps and I worked very hard to keep the tyres and brakes as warm as possible. I had a very good restart; I was able to get the lead straight away and we almost had a 1-2 for the team but getting both cars in the top three is pretty great too."

ROUND 13

Sergey Afanasiev maintained his P2 start position throughout round 13 but was unable to catch the leader and finished ahead of Erik Janis.

A blistering start allowed the ISR driver to make up three places, before taking the chequered flag ahead of team-mate Alexander Rossi.

"It means a lot to me because it in the end this is the next step to GP2," said Leimer. "Having such a good result means a lot for next year. I'm pretty happy; I didn't think we would do so well this year. I won all the Saturday races apart from in Budapest so far this season, and I was also on the podium in Spa for the second race... I'm pretty happy!!

ROUND 14

Josef Kral led a 1-2 finish for his team with Vladimir Arabadzhiev in round 14. Scoring his second win of the season, Kral took the lead from third on the grid, passing team-mate Arabadzhiev and Simon Trummer before heading into Turn 1. A difficult start saw Arabadzhiev drop from pole position to second place, which he maintained until the chequered flag despite constant efforts from a third-placed Pål Varhaug. Averaging a gap of seven tenths to Arabadzhiev throughout the 21-lap round, Varhaug fought hard to overtake

the Bulgarian driver to no avail.

"This is a really good result," said Kral. "We improved a lot throughout the season and there was a lot of bad luck for me so far so I'm really happy for the win. Today felt a lot like last year, where I won the weekend's second race too so I had some experience! The start was really good; it was probably the main part of the race. Sergey Afanasiev raced to a second-place finish despite starting the race in sixth place. The young Russian climbed to fourth thanks to a strong start before passing team-mate Vladimir Arabadzhiev for third and being promoted to second through Pål Varhaug's retirement.

Arabadzhiev followed in third after defending his position from team-mate Josef Kral and ISR's Alexander Rossi for the majority of the race. The faultless performance allowed the Bulgarian to claim his fifth podium of the season.

"It was really important for me to get the seventh win," said Leimer. "I really wanted to break Chris van der Drift's record. That's why it was really important to get a good qualifying and also a good start. Then it was like every race, I was driving at the front, doing my own race and tried to be consistent as much as possible. In the end I was pretty fast and set the fastest time on the last lap."

ROUND 16

Rossi clinched the 2009 IFM Rookies' Title in the last round of the season on Sunday after winning his third win of the year.

The 17-year-old American moved to second place from a fourth-place grid slot after an excellent start, before pressuring team-mate Erik Janis for the majority of the race. Rossi eventually took the lead on lap 12, pulling away to win the race unchallenged.

Kral claimed his sixth podium of the season after crossing the finish line in second place. Having started fifth on the grid, the Czech driver was third by the end of lap one and passed Janis with three laps to go for P2. Team-mate Afanasiev used Kral's move to overtake Janis on

Kral's move to overtake Janis on the same lap and secured third place, his ninth podium of the year, as well as the runner-up title in the drivers' classification. "It's been fantastic to come out and race in Europe," said Rossi. "This year had quite a few ups and downs but it's definitely been an experience and it's great to win a title in my first season."
